Omarama's new Community Centre is another step closer.

Last week we received confirmation from the Otago Community Trust that they will provide funding of \$95,000 towards our total rebuilding costs.

This brings our total available funds to approximately \$375,000. Architects and consent fees of \$15,000 approximately have already been paid by the Association to date.

Our next step is to approach Internal Affairs and apply for Lottery Funding. The cutoff for this is 29<sup>th</sup> February so we are hopeful that a positive response from them will enable us to commence this project in about mid 2012.



#### **UPPER WAITAKI POLICE NEWS**



Another month has passed, and I have processed my first Drink driver at Omarama station, following a crash last week. he ticked all the boxes for the main contributors for road deaths in NZ so was lucky to walk away with minor injury.

Alcohol, High Speed, and under 25.

However the good thing is that he wasn't a local, so well done to you all, that have been responsible drinkers and not drivers.

One issue I have noticed is the speeding past our school. Again this seems to be mainly visitors passing through. In the last few weeks I have tried to show a presence and each time I have stopped at least 3 cars doing 70kph or more! Again no locals so well done.

I am going to clamp down on it hard in the next month, and again at the beginning of next year, until these people get the message. At 50kph there is a good chance any child hit will survive, mainly because breaking distances are a lot less, than at 70kph when it is likely to be fatal or at the least serious injury. I expect traffic to slow to 50kph or **even better** down to 40kph past schools, especially at the peak times of 8-9am and 3-4pm when kids are coming and leaving. Kids are unpredictable so we need to be prepared to stop in a hurry.

I will ticket anyone going over 50kph past a school at that time, regardless of who it is, so be warned. I am in the process of trying to organise flashing school zone signs but they won't be here till next year, (if) the council agree to supply them.

I recently took a computer fraud complaint in which it appears the email and faceboook accounts were hijacked. These people are very capable scammers, so be aware it is still happening. If you have anyone ring you, stating your computer has been hacked, and they go on to ask you to log on to a site and click "yes" to allow them remote access, be very sure who it is your actually talking to. In all honesty I wouldn't do it. Make sure you have different passwords to each account and include at least 6 letters and 2 numbers in it, this makes it harder to crack. Remember, if it smells like a dog, barks like a dog and looks like a dog, it probably is a dog. In other words if it doesn't feel right, it probably isn't. Disconnect your internet and contact your provider advising them of your issues. In all honesty cyber crime is very hard to resolve as it is mostly overseas offenders. Never give your bank accounts/ pass- words/or personal details to someone over the phone. I say this because it is still happening...including to my sister not that long ago!

I think this is the last issue for the year, so I would like to wish you all a safe and merry Christmas and thanks for being such a great community. I look forward to many more Christmas's to come.

#### The Legend of Kukuruwhatu

In the old days, very long ago Pioioi (the ground lark) and Kukuruwhata (the Dotterel) were not birds – they were men and they were great friends. An old witch named Hine-i-te-morari had a grand-daughter, Whano, who was very beautiful. As her beauty was spoken of far and near she was sought after by many. However, when a suitor tried to carry her off the old woman caught him and put him in prison. Thus Whano remained unwed.

Now Pioioi and Kukuruwhatu both fell in love with this famous girl but being great friends they could not agree between themselves who should try his luck. They knew that the witchcraft of Hine-i-te-morari, the grandmother, was very great and to be feared. After some discussion they agreed to draw lots, the successful one to go and court the girl and chance the old woman's magic. If the winner failed to appear after a certain time it would be proof that his suit was unsuccessful; and the other could go ahead and try his luck. Accordingly they drew lots and Kukuruwhatu proved the winner.

He went to pay court to Whano but when he tried to carry her off the old woman took hold of him, put him in prison and branded him across the chest. After the time agreed had elapsed and Kukuruwhatu failed to return, Pioioi said to himself "Aha! Aha! My friend must be in prison. Now I shall go and court this beautiful girl."

After waiting a few days longer off he went, feeling very pleased with himself and full of confidence. When he arrived at Whano's home the old lady immediately proceeded to take him prisoner. Pioioi said to her, "Hold on! Not so fast – don't make me captive just yet. I have a lovely song I want to sing to you first."

The old lady said, "All right, all right. I shall hear your song."

So Pioioi sang to her:

"Tie tie – eke

Tie tie – eke

E whanotanaki

Whe a kai ai

Te heru."

When Pioioi finished the verse the old lady caught hold of him again, intending to put him safely in prison, but Pioioi cried, "Hold on, hold on a bit! Don't put me in prison yet! I must give you the second verse."

She agreed, and during the time he was singing he danced round the fire and managed to finish his song right beside the girl, who was near to the door. He snatched her up and sped swiftly away with her before anything could be done about it. The old lady called to him to bring her back but no! He would not turn round – he flew away with her – he had been turned into a bird!

The old lady then called out to her grand-daughter, "You will never see me when it's a bright day like this . . . You'll only see me when it's misty, raining or snowing."

So Pioioi took the girl away – but Kukuruwhatu had only the brown mark across his chest to show for his adventure.

#### Lindis Pass Conservation Group

You wouldn't have noticed it yet but 665 tall tussocks have been planted into the Lindis Pass Scenic Reserve. These are plants grown from seed collected at the Pass two years ago as a joint project between the Lindis Pass Conservation Group and the Otago Polytechnic Horticultural Unit at Cromwell. This is just Stage 1 of a DOC-funded community project to trial manual tall tussockre-vegetation. It may possibly be the first time this sort of work has been undertaken. Stage 2 will involve planting out some 300 tussocks Te Kakano nursery is growing from tillers collected at the Pass. The Lindis Pass Conservation Group was established 8 years ago to carry out volunteer conservation work in the Lindis Pass Scenic Reserve, one of New Zealand's most well known high country tall tussock landscapes.

Keeping the sweeping tussock rangeland free of brier bushes and pest broom is also a core activity. Every year the group explores the area and records the lizards, insects and plants seen.

It's a fantastic uplifting environment to work in and great for older children to learn about nature conservation. Workdays are held once a month on a weekend from September to May. All tools, equipment and transport provided. 




