Ahuriri Issues:- 1st February 2012

Water / Sewerage Systems - Omarama

Over New Year we had a number of problems, the worst, having no water supply for several hours. This meant that we would be unable to fight a fire of any magnitude, not to mention all the businesses which had guests wanting showers and meals etc.

Whitestone Contracting have given me an assurance that they are contracting a 24 hour service provider that will alert WC the moment a problem is detected. This effectively adds another check level to the system which should improve service.

From this event, you will have noticed the very strong smell of chlorine, which I am assured will dissipate over time. I have heard of a few problems with clothes being bleached and complaints about the water being undrinkable because of the chlorine concentration. If you would like any clarification on this issue, please contact WDC 0800108081.

Omarama's water supply is due to be ungraded in the next financial year and I am hopeful that the new system would be able to operate without the use of chlorine. It would instead, use a UV filter system. Council Officers are currently looking for a suitable site for a bore.

Water Supply – Otematata

There have been two major stoppages last year with Otematata's water supply system. Both have left Otematata without water for a considerable time

After discussions with Council Officers, I have been advised that when the new town supply comes on-stream, these problems will be drastically reduced. The main feeds into the town have become corroded and have been the main contributor to supply problems.

I have also received a number of complaints about the reduced pressure for the water supply. From information I have received, the town is running at a PSI of 69. This is in line with firefighting standards. I am also advised that if the pressure is increased this could cause problems with those houses that have older supply pipes.

If you are having problems with showers, it may pay to check the shower head to ensure it hasn't accumulated debris from flushing of the system.

Mowing for Kurow

I have had a meeting with Glenn Campbell (CEO - WCL), and have discussed the issues surrounding the mowing and the poor quality of workmanship. He has given me an undertaking that he will look at the way the contract is to be carried out and come back to me with solutions.

Additionally to that, Erik van der Spek (WDC) has confirmed that the mowing will be increased from 2 mows a year, to 6.

I believe we need to have a subcontractor carry out this work, who is preferably local and has "buy in" to what is happening in Kurow.

Rubbish Collection

This New Year's day, Omarama had rubbishing on the streets. I have raised this problem with WDC officers and the CEO of WCL and have advised that this is not acceptable and we expect this not to happen again.

Freedom Camping

Late last year WDC adopted the national legislation to deal freedom campers which are not self-contained. I was approached by a camper at Ahuriri arm campsite, who reported a fellow camper defecating by the river. He supplied a photo and registration number of the offender.

This was passed on to WDC, who proceeded to send an instant fine to the rental company concerned. Unfortunately, the legislation had been watered down. This means that the rental company does not have to pass this fine onto the perpetrator and WDC cannot fine the rental company directly.

I am informed that the initial rule simply allowed the rental company to be fined and they would recover their costs from the renter of the vehicle. As you can see above, this takes quite a bit of clout out of this legislation. I will be bringing this up at the next Community Board meeting to see if we can enact a change in our local bylaw to cover this situation.

Please, however, don't stop getting these details, because it is important we keep pursuing these itinerant sh...ers!

Roading Maintenance - Ahuriri

I have received varying comments about the roading network services, some have been complementary and many others have been highly critical of the maintenance standard.

The roading contract comes up for renewal in March this year, so it is very important that Council receives your feedback on roading issues, so that we can objectively assess what is happening in the valley.

Also, the town fire brigades are the backbone of our towns and are very much appreciated by all.

There are a number of projects in the offing for the towns and with the Alps 2 Ocean trail picking up steam, the agricultural sector in a much stronger position, the wine industry and recreational tourism (both Kiwi & international) showing steady numbers, I think the valley is in a strong position to show positive growth.

This brings me to the conclusion that it is a must for our area to receive good service from Council and its contractors. I think we have plenty of room for improvement, so let me know of your concerns and I will push them at Council level.



a fairly serious car crash near the Lindis pass. I would like to say a big well done to the Local Search and rescue guys who attended the glider crash and completed the body recovery, a job no one relishes, but well done nonetheless.

The remainder of the Xmas was pretty non eventful. I had a few car crashes, boat crashes and some clowns shooting something out of cars, but apart from that it was pretty good. The Rodeo and Bark up competition were both well organised events and I ha no issues with either, I believe that's because both organisers took a great attitude towards their host responsibilities, so well don to both.

I am still working on signs for the School, thanks to those of you who have contacted me, with their views and suggestions. NZ have been more than receptive and are going to conduct a survey first, so we can come up with an appropriate plan of what sign to use, and where they should go.

There is a National operation "Op Back to School" which starts at the beginning of the school year and lasts for a few weeks which is aimed at targeting anyone speeding past the schools, so please keep the speed down, it won't only be me around. At the end of the operation it would great to see that no locals were caught offending.

The majority of the kids I saw at the site were all 18-21 yrs, so unless they were committing an offence, there nothing stopping them from drinking, and certainly nothing the Police can do. Just my thoughts and I should mention not the views of the NZ Police.


